The standard deviation of an investment's returns is a measure of how much they can differ from its average return. It is a measure of risk and, as a result, SD volatility. Investors can use the standard deviation as a risk indicator to see how volatile their investments have been in the past. A higher standard deviation indicates that an investment is more variable or riskier.

The Sharpe ratio is a tool that allows investors to compare the return on investment to the risk involved. This ratio is derived by subtracting the risk-free rate from SI the return of the portfolio and dividing the result by the investment's standard deviation.

Tracking error is a financial performance metric that evaluates the difference between an investment portfolio's return variations and the return ΤE

- fluctuations of a set benchmark. Standard deviations are the most common way to measure return variability.
- β The volatility of a mutual fund in relation to its market benchmark is known as beta
- For a given level of risk, alpha is the excess return over the market benchmark а
- IR The information ratio demonstrates the fund manager's consistency in providing superior risk adjusted performance.
